

## **RICHARD T. REMINGER**

Mr. Reminger is the founder and retired CEO of Reminger Co., LPA, a law firm headquartered in Cleveland, Ohio. Prior to his retirement, he specialized in the defense of civil matters before juries in a broad spectrum of liability lawsuits. In his later career, Mr. Reminger concentrated in the defense of physicians and hospitals, including Cleveland Clinic. He was the recipient of his law school's Man of the Year Award in 1989. ## **ROBB ALEY ALLAN**

Mr. Allan, who was born in Paris, was a LandSat program research associate for NASA's Goddard Institute of Space Studies in New York and then a reporter/researcher at Newsweek, primarily covering science and technology. He was executive vice president with Myron A. Minskoff, Inc., a New York City real estate holding and development company. From 1987 to 1991, Mr. Allan was president of Helical Systems Ltd., which specialized in developing database and information systems for small enterprises. Since 1991 he has been president of Gulfstream Group, Inc., a family office focussed on real estate investment. Mr. Allan belongs to the Family Office Exchange, the Institute for Private Investors, and the Association for Computing Machinery. He served in the US Environmental Protection Agency in 1980-83 as director of the Office of Management Systems and Evaluation and 1989-92 as EPA's Associate Administrator. Mr. Crampton was vice president for communications and environmental affairs with Waste Management Inc., vice president for communications with the American Medical Association, and is currently president and CEO of the Burpee Museum of Natural History in Rockford, IL. ## **RALPH GUILD**

In 1957, Mr. Guild was sent to New York by McGavren Radio – a San Francisco-based firm devoted to representing radio advertisers – to open their first East Coast office. By 1967, McGavren Radio had become McGavren Guild; by 1973, Mr. Guild had become the company's president and COO. In order to offer the communications and marketing expertise he believed radio stations would come to expect from their representatives, he launched Interep Radio in 1981 as a holding company to bring independent rep firms together under a single corporate umbrella. In 1988, the company became the Interep Radio Store, presenting Mr. Guild's vision of a company that would be a single source for radio advertising and marketing support services. As avenues for advertising expanded in the 1990s, Interep started Radio 2000, a new business development program designed to increase the medium's share of total advertising dollars, and Interep became the largest sales and marketing company dedicated solely to radio advertising. Mr. Guild is chairman of Interep, and president and theater producer/investor at Guild Media. He was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame in 1998 and is a member of the board of trustees of the Paley Center for Media.

## **GERALD R. JORDAN, JR.**

Mr. Jordan graduated from Harvard College. Following four years of service in the Navy as a lieutenant, he graduated from the Harvard Business School and began his investment career at Putnam Management Company as a security analyst.
